## **Bayonet Soldier Found Dead in Baumholder**

BAUMHOLDER, Germany – A Soldier with 3rd Battalion, 4th Infantry Regiment, 170th Infantry Brigade Combat Team was found dead in his barracks room at approximately 6 a.m. May 30.

The Soldier's identity will be released 24 hours after the next of kin have been notified.

U.S. Military and German law enforcement agencies are investigating the incident.
